

## Neahwa Park's <u>Highlights</u>

Damaschke Field - Baseball Stadium -Home of the PGCBL's Oneonta Outlaws. Home games are played from June to July. Area schools and baseball camps also use Damaschke Field.

Veteran's Memorial Walk - Construction to transform the former War Memorial Drive from a vehicular roadway into a picturesque pedestrian promenade was completed in the spring of 2010. The walkway highlights numerous historical markers and memorials.



*Ted Christman Field* - Softball Field -This lighted facility is used organized adult softball and by area schools.

Other Neahwa Park facilities include, two basketball courts, tennis courts, a sand volleyball court, a playground, two picnic pavilions (reservations recommended), a skateboarding park, and many multi-sport fields.
