### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Highway/Water & Sewer -

Motion made by Riddell-Kent seconded by Mowers to sign the 284 agreement with Superintendent Hurtubise for the following work in the amount of \$207,775.00:

Wilber Lake Road 1.04 miles commencing at East St. \$12,500.00 Pony Farm Road .45 miles commencing at County Industrial Park \$48,000.00 Richards Ave 35,593 sq. ft., commencing at Butler St to Canal St \$33,605.00 Gifford Hill Road 1.74 commencing at Peebles Hill Rd \$20,000.00 Wisteria Ave 67,930 sq. ft. commencing at County Rt 8 to Petri Dr. \$65,390.00 Plains Dr, Arrowhead Dr, and Roberts Way 9,387 sq. yds. \$28,280.00

Southside Sewer District- Operations and Maintenance Charge: \$6.15/1000 gallons

Woodland Water District Operations and Maintenance Charge: \$8.69/1000 gallons

# RESOLUTION ALLOWING RESTAURANTS TO MOVE EXISTING SEATING CAPACITY TO OUTDOORS

**WHEREAS**, on March 7, 2020, New York State's Governor, Andrew M. Cuomo, issued Executive Order No. 202, declaring a State disaster emergency for the entire State of New York;

**WHEREAS**, both travel-related cases and community contact transmission of COVID-19 have been documented in New York State and are expected to be continue;

WHEREAS, New York State's Governor, Andrew M. Cuomo, pursuant to Section 29-a of Article 2-B of the Executive Law, was given the authority to temporarily suspend or modify any statute, local law, ordinance, order, rule, or regulation, or parts thereof, of any agency during a State disaster emergency, if compliance with such statute, local law, ordinance, order, rule, or regulation would prevent, hinder, or delay action necessary to cope with the disaster emergency or if necessary to assist or aid in coping with such disaster;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the aforesaid authority, Governor Cuomo issued Executive Order No. 202.3, dated March 16, 2020, which ordered all restaurants in the state of New York to cease serving patrons food or beverage on-premises effective March 16, 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic;

**WHEREAS**, on April 26, 2020, Governor Cuomo announced a phased approach to reopen industries and businesses in New York in four phases based upon a data-driven, regional analysis, which as of the date of this resolution Oneonta is currently in Phase Two;

**WHEREAS**, on June 3, 2020 Governor Andrew Cuomo has declared that restaurants located in regions that have already entered Phase Two may reopen for outdoor dining only beginning June 4, 2020;

**WHEREAS**, it is anticipated that restaurant will be allowed to reopen for indoor dining in Phase Three, with restrictions;

**WHEREAS**, in anticipation of reduced density requirements inside restaurants as a result of Governor Cuomo's Executive Orders and guidelines related to the COVID-19 crisis, the Town Board of the Town of Oneonta wishes to assist those restaurants located in the Town of Oneonta during their reopening;

# NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Town Board of the Town of Oneonta directs the Town of Oneonta officials to allow any existing restaurants that are able to safely provide outdoor seating consistent with Governor Cuomo's Executive Orders and industry related guidelines to do so without seeking site plan modification from the Planning Board. The restaurants that wish to do this will not increase the seating capacity above what was authorized in their original approvals and will follow all state guidelines pertaining to the operation of their business, including those guidelines issued by the State Liquor Authority. This resolution will be effective immediately and remain in effect until October 15, 2020 and may be extended by the Town Board.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
